

The Field Report

Advocacy/Legislative Highlights Affecting K-12 Independent Schools

Nonpublic Pupil Aids - Eligibility for Standardized Tests.

The April 9 memorandum from Greg Sogaard, MDE education finance specialist, states, "The commissioner of education has determined that the ACT college entrance examination meets the definition of a standardized test under Minnesota Statutes, section 123B.41, Subdivision 2, making the purchase of the ACT an eligible expense within the textbook/standardized test/individualized instructional materials component of the nonpublic pupil aid program." MISF received notification that the MDE has approved continued use of Nonpublic Pupil Aids to pay for the ACT in 2016. Usage of these funds for the ACT beyond 2016 are not yet known. MISF will provide information once available.

Nonpublic Pupil Aids Fiscal Year 2016 Rates of

Entitlement. Minnesota K-12 nonpublic schools are eligible to be reimbursed through their district for expenditures incurred in providing certain instructional materials and pupil support services. The MDE has published current Fiscal Year 2016 rates of entitlement here. The MDE may readjusted these rates on or about October 15 when actual appropriation and program participation figures are known. It is important that all Minnesota K-12 nonpublic schools submit the appropriate forms so that accurate rates are calculated and provided. More information along with required forms and deadlines are found on the MDE website.

Member schools are welcome to call or email MISF with specific questions regarding legislative/advocacy issues.

The staff will research these questions and provide counsel to assist the school or contact information for the individual with whom the school may correspond for more precise answers.
